A PLAN to open a new pedestrian accessway to the New Street car park off Main Street and to open up the present pedestrian way to Tuohill's Lane to oneway traffic off Main Street to the car park was one of the major decisions taken by Killarney UDC at a special meeting held to consider the traffic situation in the town.

It was further agreed that if traffic lights were to be erected at the junction of Plunkett Street and Main St. then a synchronised set would also have to be erected at the New St.-Main St. junction. It was also suggested that grids should be painted at these junct-
